

Village of Crooksville
Council Workshop Meeting
March 09, 2026

Mayor Mohler calls the meeting to order with the following council members present: Mr. Hampton, Mr. Locke, Mr. Loomis, Ms. Smith and Ms. McKinney. Mr. Redfern was absent. Lacey Tumblin and Courtney Edwards were also present.

First up on the agenda, Teddy Gorrell and Kerry McKormack with Flock safety were on a video call. They wanted to touch on the real time precision policing alerts. If there is a license plate that is associated with a crime passing through, it will alert the police right away. It also works well for missing people such as Amber alerts, and silver alerts for senior citizens that may get lost behind the wheel. If you are not in a vehicle that has been entered into the system as associated with a crime or missing person, nothing happens. The Police Department are only notified when vehicles that are tagged have passed by the camera. These deviecs are NOT used to catch people who are speeding. The data is saved for 30 days, to allow the departments to utilize the information for their investigations. They are hard deleted and uncoverable after 30 days. It can take a photo of the vehicle and tell you what vehicle it is. It does NOT take a photo of the people inside the vehicle; it does NOT have facial recognition. It captures a photo of the back of the vehicle. There was a brief discussion about the possibility of talking to the school to see if they would like to go in on the cost of having a camera out by the school. The Council agreed to have it on the agenda for next week.

Next up, Mrs. Tumblin stated that the guys are starting to fill potholes with the cold mix. The hot mix is not being made yet. As soon as they get the hot mix, they will start patching the potholes. Mrs. Tumblin stated that they should get it by the end of the month or beginning of April.

Up next, Mrs. Tumblin and Mrs. Edwards passed out a spreadsheet regarding raises. Ms. McKinney asked if Lisa Osborn is retiring and if that position is being replaced. Mrs. Tumblin stated that she will have more info on that at the next meeting, but they are not anticipating hiring a full-time position as of right now. She states that between the wage, insurance, and OPERS, that will save a good bit of money. The council were all good with \$.75-1.00, except Ms. McKinney who stated she felt \$.50 was the maximum. In the end, \$.75 was agreed upon. They also agreed the pay scale can be moved up \$3.00 so it doesn't have to be looked at every year for a couple years at least.

Mrs. Tumblin stated that Maria Thompson put in an application for pool manager. Jada May has also turned in her application for assistant manager again. We have had a few people pick up applications for lifeguards. The lifeguards pay will be minimum wage of \$11.00 and leave the manager and assistant manager at the previous wages, \$12.00 & \$13.00. Mrs. Tumblin stated that they have tossed around a few ideas to help bring in additional money, the pool parties will be a little different this year as well. She stated that Monday-Thursday, pool parties will be from 8-

10pm and on the weekends, they will still do the 6-8 & 8-10pm. They also agreed to raise the pool parties from \$150 to \$175.


Next, Mrs. Tumblin wanted to remind everyone of the meeting in Newark all day Wednesday, March 18, 2026, from 9-3:30pm.

Next, Chief Alexander stated that we need to post another officer. Office Tweedy has taken a new position.

Without any further discussion, the meeting is adjourned.
