ORDINANCE No. 2518

ORDINANCE DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTY SURPLUS, OBSOLETE AND UNFIT FOR MUNICIPAL PURPOSES AND AUTHORIZING DISCARD OF THE SAME TO POLICE AUXILIARY FOR FUNDRAISING PURPOSES

Whereas, Ohio Revised Code § 721.15 provides that when it is determined by the legislative authority that municipal personal property is not needed for public use, or is obsolete or unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and that the property has no value, the legislative authority may discard or salvage that property; and

Whereas, the Village of Crooksville owns a 2009 Ford Crown Victoria police cruiser that is obsolete and unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and which has no value; and

Whereas, Chief of Police, having supervision or management of the above-referenced property, has recommended and approved its declaration as surplus and after determination that it has no value, has recommended and approved its disposal without sale;

Whereas, the Village of Crooksville wishes to discard said property by donating it to the Village of Crooksville Police Auxiliary, a non-profit tax exempt organization, for fundraising purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, a majority of the members of the Council of the Village of Crooksville, Perry County, Ohio, concurring therein, **BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED:**

Section 1: That the Village of Crooksville hereby declares that its 2009 Ford Crown Victoria police cruiser is no longer needed for Village/public purpose and is therefore declared surplus personal property.

Section 2: That the Village of Crooksville further declares that its 2009 Ford Crown Victoria police cruiser is obsolete, unfit for the use for which it was acquired, and has no value.


Section 3: That in accordance with the provisions of Ohio Revised Code § 721.15(C), the Council authorizes and directs the Chief of Police to discard said property by donating it to the Village of Crooksville Police Auxiliary, a non-profit tax exempt organization, for the Auxiliary's fundraising purposes.

Section 4: That this Ordinance is effective at the earliest date allowed by law.


