Council Workshop Meeting  
July 25, 2022

Mayor Mohler calls the meeting to order with the following members present: Mr. Hampton, Mr. Loomis, Mr. Redfern and Ms. Smith. Mr. Locke and Mr. Walters were absent. Lacey Tumblin and Courtney Edwards were also present.

First up on the agenda, Mrs. Tumblin asked if 08/14 was good with everyone for the last day of the pool. Wet and Wild on 08/13 & Dog Days on 08/14.

Next up, a thank you to the Perry County Community Club. They paid for a free swim and water on 07/08 and a donation to the pool. Also, a discussion about getting the baby pool fixed for next season.

We received a quote from Terry's Tree Service on getting some trees removed by Watt Hill tank. Hopefully getting started on those this week.

The Burr Oak bill has gone down about 2 million gallons since January.

Marilyn Horner's contract was discussed, regarding getting paid by mileage or by travel time. Mr. Hampton stated that he agreed with Mr. Walters when he had voted no. He doesn't agree with getting paid both ways.

Mr. Locke joined the meeting.

Next up is Faithful Performance Based Bond. It would be the same coverage but will save about \$500 a year. This will be put on the agenda for next week.

Mayor Mohler spoke of increases that residents are going to see in their property insurance.

SWOT Analysis discussed at last week's meeting. A very lengthy discussion regarding zoning took place. Mr. Hampton brought having a "hit list" plan again for the next year of things that we want to get done and to be able to check those things off the list.

The Frash's joined the meeting to discuss the Indigent Burial Fund.


Karen Brown discussed Cherry Lane and the work that is still needing to be done to it. All other property owners have signed to get the project off of the ground except for one.

Mayor Mohler spoke briefly about the dedication of part of State Route 93 for Dave Theisen and Steve Carletti, two firefighters who had lost their lives in the line of duty.

Christy Catalytics had a nice 100-year celebration party at the park. They donated a picnic table that was added to the pool area.
