SAFETY: The equipment has been installed on the new Interceptor. It is very nice, but makes some noise.

The Ohio Director of EMS presented the department with a check for \$32,264.00. \$28,000 will be used to purchase a new heart monitor for the station.

There are presently 44 active COVID cases in Muskingum County. There are multiple cases active in Crooksville at this time.

Rodney lets everyone know that both Bryan and Devyn both need new vest to help ensure their safety. This will cost an estimated \$1,200.

OLD BUSINESS: A lengthy discussion is held regarding the Cares Act Funds. Many people feel strongly that more money should be given to the food pantry. Mayor Mohler would like to set aside funds to help residents who were affected financially by COVID-19 to help with them with their water, sewer, and storm water bills. No decisions are made, and there will have to be an extensive discussion regarding this at next weeks workshop meeting. Mayor Mohler lets Council know that there have been a few snags in finalizing the COVID-19 testing at the park. He hopes if this is successful then they will be able to do a second round of testing. He wants to “focus on being local”. They have set aside 150 COVID swab tests. We will only pay for the test that we use. This testing will take place in a four-hour window.

A discussion in held regarding the paving that Mayor Mohler would like to see take place in the year 2021. The planned streets are Keystone, Sycamore, Star, East Main from the Beaumont building to the dead end, East Main from the Railroad to China street.

This year the paving that is planned should start on the second week in October is all of Washington, all of Pine, all of Heskett, upper and lower Washington, the alley connecting Washington, East Main, West Main to 93, North Buckeye to the South end of the Burley Bridge, South Buckeye to the Main-Industrial Drive intersection. This is all subject to change. Mayor Mohler lets everyone know that there will be more paving to come in 2022.

Tom lets Council know that the climbing wall for the pool has been approved through the Neighborhood Revitalization Grant. It will be 3 sections by 2 sections. He is still hopeful that they will get the concrete work done around the pool this year. A rubber roof will be put on the Rec Center, rather than a metal one. The metal roof would not be a possibility due to the structure of the roof, as well as the fact that HVAC unit is currently located on top of the roof.

NEW BUSINESS: Kylie King is a former resident of Crooksville. After attending and graduating from College she would like to work with Crooksville to help transform the Community. She is present to discuss Community Engagement under the current conditions. Her interest is in transforming rural communities. She has thoughts on both short- and long-term possibilities for Crooksville, and would like to have a sit down with both Tom Collins and Mayor Mohler. Bill Hampton asks Kylie if she thinks she could help with grants, and working with the school to get a Band Stand built at the Park. She feels like that is something she could get involved in.

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Shane Dorsey will be having basketball sign up on November 1st. Due to the COVID the basketball practices will be limited to only the participants, no parents or siblings to watch. They will have to get the square footage of the area to know just how many people will be able to attend the basketball games. According to the policies put out there can only be 15% of the maximum occupancy allowed due to COVID-19.

Tom Collins wanted to give out a big Thank You to Jan Baughman for all of her work to help get the financing for the new Fire/EMS Station. This has taken a great deal of work, and planning.

ADJOURNMENT: Without any further discussion Approval is needed for the adjournment of the Council Meeting. A motion is made by Mr. Allen, and seconded by Mr. Loomis.
