The third payment from the COVID Cares Act Fund has been received, it was \$89,411. The money will all need to be allocated by November 20th. The total of Cares Act money totals around \$160,000 between the three payments.

There is a lengthy discussion on how the money should be spent. If we do not get the money spent, we will be sending the money back, so we need to get it spent as soon as possible. We have set aside money for the help of Crooksville Residents for the assistance of utility bill payments. We have been notified that HAPCAP as also set aside a large amount of money for the same thing, and they have request that if we have any calls from people that need additional help that we refer them to HAPCAP.

Many ideas are thrown around by Tom Collins, Mayor Mohler, and Council. Some of the ideas include:

- Radio read meters. This would qualify because it would help with the social distancing due to the fact that the homes would not to be entered in order to read the water meters.
 - Mayor Mohler is still working on getting the COVID testing figured out to have it at the park.
 - I-Waves have been installed.
 - They are in the process of working on getting touchless sinks, faucets, toilets, water fountains, and bottle fillers.
 - Does Fire/EMS need PPE?
 - Does the Police Department need PPE?
 - Should there be assistance for small businesses?
 - Rocky Chevalier questions if they could get “socially distanced” park equipment.
 - Fred Redfern questions if they could use it to televise the Council meetings?
 - Mayor Mohler lists how other places have spent their money. Including the purchase of Chrome books to be used by students with their school work, Internal expenses, and benches. He also states that after the money that has been planned out is spent, he estimates that there should be \$30,000-\$35,000 remaining.
 - Would hotspots for the Rec Center be helpful for the students?
- Tom feels strongly that they need to make a list, and start spending the money before they run out of time, and lose the money.

With the talk about the swing set this brings the idea of purchasing a new swing set to Council's mind. They decide that there should be a new one bought to update the park. The motion is made by Mr. Hampton, and seconded by Mr. Allen.

Rocky questions on whether some money should be donated to the school to help them get additional masks for students who need them. Mr. Hampton lets him know that the school has an adequate supply of masks for any student who needs one.

Mayor Mohler lets everyone know that paving will start this week weather permitting. He met with the engineers and signed a list of streets to be paved, and stated “We are Flexible on that”.

Mayor Mohler lets everyone know that Mr. Rice has had a heart attack. He has been in contact with his wife, and should be released from the hospital by Wednesday. He asks that Mr. Rice stay in everyone's thoughts and prayers as he continues to recover.

Rocky has signs that the Perry County Health department has made up for the park about it being a Smoke free/tobacco free environment. He was down there speaking to Lisa Garret, and she have him the signs to pass along to us. They are for the shelter houses

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and for the playground. She told him that if any changes needed to be made to them, to let her know, but everyone feels like they look great!

There is a short discussion on the Election tomorrow, and how important voting is.

ADJOURNMENT: Without any further discussion Mr. Hampton makes the motion to adjourn the meeting, and Ms. Smith seconds the motion.
